## **Pastoral Ponderings**

Didn't I just wish you a Merry Christmas ... obviously not, because this week we will enter the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the 40 days of preparation for the Easter season when Christians are called to deepen their spiritual lives. The 40 days of Lent are a time similar to the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness following his baptism. (There are actually 46 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter but we do not count Sunday since they are days of celebration.)

The imposition of ashes during the Ash Wednesday Service began in the 11th Century. Services have been modernized throughout the ages to meet the needs of each Christian era. The ashes remind us that we are mortal and the gift of life should be well lived. The words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." are spoked while the sign of the cross is made on the forehead or hand.

The first Sunday of Lent I will begin a series of messages developed from a study prepared by Professor Amy-Jill Levine, a distinguished seminary professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies. The study is entitled "Witness at the Cross". We often think only of Jesus and the crucifixion when Black Friday is upon us. Yet, the four gospels speak of numerous unnamed and named witnesses with multiple reactions and behaviors. The series will conclude on Palm Sunday as we enter Holy Week.

I pray that you will make time during Lent to reflect on your spiritual life and spiritual relationships.

Leave a happy note for someone. Put a small bin in your car to collect recycling. Pick up litter. Let someone go ahead of you in line. Compliment a friend. Plant something. Bake dessert for a neighbor. Walk dogs at the animal shelter. Check in on an elderly neighbor. Send a card to someone you have not recently. Tell someone why they are special to you. Donate outgrown clothes. Buy a coffee for a stranger. Pass out stickers to kids waiting in line. Talk to someone new at school. Weed or shovel for a neighbor. Donate food to the food pantry. Give a flower to someone to brighten their day. Tell a manager how good your service was. Donate socks and supplies to the homeless. Call a friend you haven't seen in a while to say hello. Tell someone how much you love them. Say hello to everyone you see. Make someone else's bed. Say thank you when you see service members. Fill a kindness jar with candy for another family. Make a busy bag for a family with young children.

February was paper recycling month. We took two loads of newspapers (a little over a ton) and earned \$100.00. Next we took the magazines and catalogs (about half a ton) and earned \$37.70. It was a good thing! Please remember that those catalogs you receive in the mail are just as desirable as magazines, at least for recycling. Meeting called to order at 7:19 p.m.by Lisa Hermann. Attendees: Todd Montague, Steve Barrett, Kathy Van Etten, John Hasenstab, Lisa Hermann, Melanie Hermann, Steve Holloway, Marilyn Hall, and Pastor Gloria Smith (via Zoom).

Kathy Van Etten led members in prayer.

Melanie Hermann motioned that the minutes from the Council Meeting held January 12, 2022, be accepted. The other Council Members agreed, and the motion was accepted.

Kathy Van Etten reviewed the January Treasurer's Report and each Council member was given a copy.

#### **Deacons Report:**

John Hasenstab recapped the January Deacons Meeting highlights, the meeting was held at Paul Petrasek's. Moderator Lisa Hermann attended. Tom Nasser is the Deacon on Duty for February 2022.

The Deacon's assignments were updated for the 2022 calendar year. It was suggested that for the next Justice Topic we invite one of our newest members and a Surgical Nurse, Karen Cizek, to possible give a presentation on the impact of Covid on the Health Care System. The Deacons also received Good and Positive feedback on the Holiday Services....Yeah! Lisa noted that the Sabbatical pay listed in the budget or the minister who will fill-in while Pastor Gloria is on Sabbatical had been increased by Council to \$7500.00 total for the three months. **Memorial Report:** Discussions was held regarding the possibility of taking a Rose Garden Offering at Mother's Day. **Religious Education Report:** Studying Black History this month, teaching life lessons as reflected in Christianity, and preparing for the yard sale. Monthly yard sale sorting and pricing is helping; students have stepped-up to move items from other locations.

**Outreach Report**: Michelle is working with the Red Cross's Blood Mobile to organize a blood drive at the church. The Saturday Morning Social Club as well as a few other leaders of other committees hope to meet in March to discuss the Social Club's status and if other committees can lend assistance in helping to coordinate Social Club events. Seong Jin has proposed goodie bags and surveys be distributed to new comers to greet them as they join us for worship. The Deacons will need to attend the next Outreach meeting to explore this project.

**Hospitality**: Todd has assigned monthly duties for the remainder of 2022, there are enough sealed snacks for the month of February. Beginning March 6, 2022 a mix of fresh and sealed items will be available for Fellowship Hour.

**Pastor Gloria's report**: New updates on Sabbatical, will update Deacons in upcoming Sunday's Deacon Meeting on February 13, 2022. A thank you note was received from Phoenix Rescue and Phoenix Outreach. Upcoming Moments of Justice, Holocaust Remembrances will be on Jewish Holiday before or after April 27, 2022. Just introducing information, there are 2 new grants, but will need entire Council and a Special Meeting for Exploration, for service projects with justice/spiritual needs. Grants also available for disaster prep, (Outreach will need to take lead). Emails sent out for webinars on how to setup safety measures, also information and webinars available on FEMA and DHS sites. A Task Force needs to be setup. Pastor Gloria will send links for Safety, Active Shooter Training. Possible to contact Search and Rescue for First Aid Training. Completing Ash Wednesday Processes.
