The ECC Council Meeting for April 12, 2023 was called to order by Moderator Lisa Herrmann at 7:04 P.M.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Kathy Van Etten: The Endowment Fund rebounded slightly during in March. The yard sale funds of \$2500.00 were disbursed to the General Fund. All Council Members in attendance were given printed copies of the Monthly Budget Report.

Attendees: Lisa Herrmann, Melanie Herrmann, Steve Barrett, Steve Holloway, Pastor Gloria Smith, Kathy Van Etten, John Hasenstab, and Todd Montague.

Prayer was led by Melanie Herrmann.

The Minutes from the March 8, 2023 ECC Council Meeting were reviewed, voted upon and accepted into the records.

The Trustees Report was given by Steve Holloway; the cement floor in the shed is now completed, thanks to Tom Nasser, Patty Roberts and Martin Cabrera. The long list of extra projects and repairs that Tony has done during the last month was presented to all in attendance and reviewed, we extend a note of gratitude to Tony for keeping the ECC Campus beautiful and an asset to our community. The irrigation box and gates were repaired by the city and water now properly flows to our campus grounds. Plumbing problems in the Sanctuary restrooms were resolved by Collins Plumbing. Michelle will be on vacation in May so we are working to ensure Office Hour Coverage.

Deacons Report was given by John Hasenstab; the Deacons met earlier in April to discuss and prep for Maundy Services, Easter, the Church Picnic, and Confirmation Services in May.

Stewardship Report by John Hasenstab: Nothing to report this month.

Financial Secretary Report given by John Hasenstab; all monies are in the bank.

Religious Education Report given by Kathy Van Etten; Youth Bulletins are now being printed and given to youth during Sunday Services. Melanie will be teaching Sunday School Class on April 30, 2023. We have youth considering the upcoming Summer Camp. Summer youth activities/plans are being explored.

Memorial Fund Report; given by Lisa Herrmann for Kathy Stock, printed copies were given to all in attendance.

Outreach Report Given by Melanie Herrmann; the MOM Mobile did not respond in a timely manner to schedule the proposed April 2023 visit to the ECC Campus, so that is no longer a calendar event.

The Hospitality Report was given by Todd Montague; this year Pentecost Sunday is also the Memorial Day weekend.

Pastor's Report was given by Pastor Gloria; Pastor Gloria will be attending the UCC Conference in El Paso, Texas beginning April 27, 2023, and will begin vacation on April 30, 2023. Confirmation will be on May 14, 2023. UCC is exploring the options for establishing a Credit Union. The UCC Bylaws changes include language changes to be more adaptive and definitive. The Mission remains the same, but statements were consolidated and combined and other areas were updated and modernized. Each committee is now setup so that the entire board does not change at the same time to meet the historical needs and ensure continuity.

Moderator's Report given by Lisa Herrmann; a future event to possibly host on the ECC Campus is Pet Adoptions, working with local Animal Shelters\groups. The Council members continue to discuss the guiding structure for ECC Mission as we are covenanted. The Calendar updates were made.

New Business: None this month.
