#### TAKING GOD TO DINNER – PART TWO

As some of you may recall, I wrote the first of these articles in March of 2016, when we had just lost the tenancy of the Great Hope Korean Church who had been sharing our worship space for a couple of years. At that point, we also lost the rental income we were receiving from them (\$1,250 per month) which constituted about 10% of our monthly budget. Fortunately, over the years, we have been able to make up that deficit through various means. However, given our high insurance premiums (\$2,300 per month), I am concerned that we need to maintain our increased monthly income over the summer.

Yes, we have a reasonable endowment that was created from the bequests of many generous parishioners who have long since passed away, but that money is only to be used for true emergencies. If we are forced to use it merely to "make ends meet," it will be gone very, very quickly. Consequently, I thought this would be a good time to re-run this article and ask for everyone's help.

To reiterate my 2016 thoughts, here's my suggestion about how to handle our current financial dilemma: Take God to Dinner!

Yes, I realize you don't know what I'm talking about, but you will in a minute. Read on. . .

The reality is that \$1,250 per month is approximately 10% of our monthly budget. This is not an insignificant amount, but it is not an insurmountable one either. Indeed, if you run the numbers, this amount can be made up fairly easily if all of us contribute to the cause. If everyone simply donates a small additional amount every month, the problem will be solved.

How much should I give, you ask? My suggestion is to consider your donation in terms of what it would cost for you to take God to dinner once a week or once a month, depending upon your lifestyle. If you're "feeling flush," perhaps you would even spring for God, Jesus, and the Holy Ghost to join you for dinner!

Indeed, considering everything that God has done for each of us through our wonderful church, it's not too much to ask that we "pick up the dinner tab" for a while in order to get us through the coming lean months.

I would further suggest that you seek guidance from the old Marxian philosophy: "From each according to his ability, to each according to his needs."

Consequently, if you are only able to take God to McDonald's once in a while, put an extra \$10 in the offering plate for that week. On the other hand, if you are able to take God, Jesus, and the Holy Ghost to dinner at Durant's, pitch an extra \$100 in the offering plate for the month – unless, of course, you are ordering drinks, in which case, you had better double that amount.

This may seem like a silly way to look at the matter, but I think you'll find it quite practical.

At the end of the day, if twelve of us who are able to do so donate an extra \$100 to our beloved church every month for the next few months (perhaps, through September), we'll get through the summer shortfall with relative ease, and we'll be ready to embark on an exciting new chapter in the fall.

Just a little food for thought . . .

#### DISASTER MINISTRY CLEAN-UP KIT MISSION

The Deacons are heading a mission to prepare clean-up kits to assist victims of wildfire and flooding during monsoon season. As you are aware, wildfires leave debris and soot even if your home is saved and flooding leaves mud, debris when the water recedes. Clean-up kits permit the homeowners and volunteers to begin cleaning as soon as they are able to return to their homes while stores may be closed or sold out of cleaning items.

The clean-up kits will be kept at Encanto so that we can immediately deliver them to Arizona areas facing disaster clean-up. Some of you may have participated in preparing kits for Church World Services. Currently, all Church World Services warehouses are located east of the Mississippi and sending the kits to them requires additional monetary funds as well as time for Church World Services to send them to disaster sites. So, we have decided that having them located at the church will permit us to be of better service to our state neighbors during depressing times.

Beginning June 25<sup>th</sup>, a clean-up kit display will be set up in Fellowship Hall so that you can see the contents of a kit. In addition, there will be a sign-up sheet for participants. Please let us know what you are willing to bring large or small. Every little item helps. If you do not want to go shopping, you can place a monetary donation (PLEASE MARK ITS INTENT ON THE ENVELOPE) in the offering plate or give it to one of the Deacons. The Deacons will then do the shopping.

#### **ECC Endowment Fund by John Hasenstab**

Lately, we have had a few questions arise regarding the ECC Endowment Fund, and I thought I would share the answers to those questions here. This article explains what the ECC Endowment Fund is and how you can contribute to it. The ECC Endowment Fund is really like our "Rainy-Day Fund." We try to use the money in this fund primarily for emergency situations that arise unexpectedly (e.g., broken air conditioners, plumbing repairs, etc.) and special projects that the church undertakes (e.g., paving the parking lot, re-carpeting the sanctuary, etc.). We try NOT to use the money in the Fund to cover regular church expenses, since if we did, the money would not last long. Accordingly, no matter what the balance is in our Endowment Fund, it is important that you continue to give generously in your weekly offerings and yearly pledges.

The majority of the money that is in the Endowment Fund came from church members passing away and leaving money to our church through their wills or trusts. If you would like to leave money to Encanto Community Church when you pass on in order to ensure that our church's ministries continue to thrive, you should do it legally through a lawyer. Usually, that means that you would formally name Encanto Community Church as a beneficiary in your will or trust. Informal designations outside of your will or trust are often forgotten or overlooked, and the money often doesn't get transferred. Notably, you can also contribute to the Endowment Fund while you are still living. Just indicate that your specific contribution is to go to the ECC Endowment Fund. The ECC Council Meeting for Wednesday, June 14, 2023 was called to order by Moderator Lisa Herrmann at 7:06 P.M. to hear the Treasurer's Report given jointly to the attendees of Trustees and Council Members.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Kathy Van Etten: The monthly expenses were covered for May after gleaning all possible monies from incoming sources such as PayPal, the yard sale residuals and our offerings. No withdrawal was taken from the Endowment Fund, which rebounded in the first few days of June, but was down over \$800.00 in the month of May. ECC will be receiving an adjustment from our Insurance Company for the previous pergola repairs completed in the Rose Garden area.

The ECC Council Meeting was formally called to order by Moderator Lisa Herrmann at 7:38 P.M. Prayer was led by Kathy Stock.

The ECC Council Meeting Minutes for the May 10, 2023 meeting were reviewed and accepted into the records by all in attendance.

Trustees Report given by Steve Holloway: Tony is collecting and receiving donated items for the fall 2023 yard sale, and has also been assisting the church's neighbors. The parsonage door west facing had to be replaced, the air units in the office and the cottage also were repaired this month, as well as other campus buildings items. The Fellowship Hall's upstairs doorways are scheduled for cleanup and clearing later this month. The lease on the parsonage is slated for renewal in August 2023, it has now been updated to reflect the approved changes including a monthly increase and a modified 30 day clause effective August 2023.

Deacons Report given by John Hasenstab: The Father's Day Lunch items were ordered today for the upcoming celebration. The Deacons will be rotating during the offerings and communion portions of the Sunday Services. The Deacons voted to assemble cleaning buckets and store them here at the church to be used in Arizona on an as needed basis.

Financial Secretary's Report given by John Hasenstab; the monies are in the bank.

Religious Education Report given by Kathy Van Etten: There will be no summer camp this year for the ECC Youths, but workshops will be done as well as summer projects.

Memorial Fund Report given by Kathy Stock: Printed copies were given to all in attendance.

Outreach Report given by Melanie Herrmann; the Outreach Committee has not met for the month of June.

Hospitality Report given by Todd Montague; Cookies are in the Cookie Bank and we recently have all enjoyed cake. A new sign-up sheet will be available at the end of June.

Pastors Report given by Pastor Gloria Smith: Rev. Gloria will be on vacation beginning the last week of June thru the first week of July. The overhead and shipping costs causes us to pivot and rethink the way we do the Cleaning Buckets Project, they will now be stored here at ECC and disbursed around the State of Arizona as the needs arise. The passing of the peace will begin again after the summer, at the end of summer also the communion supplies bulk\individual will be discussed by the Trustees and Council.

Moderator's Report by Lisa Herrmann; No new items on the agenda. Michelle and I will be meeting to explore Servant Keeper usages and functions. There will be no Council meeting in July. Calendar updates were made for the upcoming months thru the fall.

Old Business: Worship in the sanctuary in July and August.

New Business: Energy reduction and sustainability plans information per Pastor Gloria Smith will be posted online and a page will be in the July Pilgrim listing items available for sale prior to the fall yard sale.

The ECC Council Meeting was adjourned by Moderator Lisa Herrmann at 9:03 P.M..
