Pastoral Ponderings

September 1st, has been designated as World Day of Prayer for Creation. It is also the beginning of the Liturgical Season of Creation (or known by some other denominations: Creation Time). During this time we acknowledge the wonderful aspects of God's creation and as caretakers of all of creation we need improve our sense of unity with creation. In other words, we are co-creators with God and stand with all that God has created not apart from it.

The extreme weather and disasters of this year has is a loud cry from creation as our common home is jeopardized. In response to this cry, the members of the Season of Creation Advisory Committee of the World Council of Churches, the theme "Let Justice and Peace Flow" has been chosen with a seasonal logo of a mighty river.

Two of the Bishops on the Season of Creation Advisory Committee share the following quotes as to the importance of this liturgical season within the church:

"There has never before been a time, in the history of human existence, when we have so gravely threatened not only our own existence, but that of the rest of the living world. But it's not too late to act, if we do it now, if we do it together." - Bishop Olivia Graham, Diocese of Reading, Church of England

"The Season of Creation is a vital and necessary reminder that God's saving, healing, justice-seeking love extends to every part of creation. As the Church, the household of God, we are called to live out this life-giving love for the benefit of all." - Rev Faith Whitby, Bishop of the Central District, Methodist Church of Southern Africa

I pray that you will use the coming weeks to ponder the needs of creation and the small ways you can contribute to living a more just and peaceful life that allows all of creation's life to flourish.

The prayer below can be prayed often during this coming season.

Creator of All,

From your communion of love life sprung forth like a mighty river and the whole cosmos came into being. On this Earth of overflowing love, the Word was made flesh and went forth with the life-giving waters proclaiming peace and justice for all creation.

You called human beings to till and keep your garden. You placed us into right relationship with each creature, but we failed to listen to the cries of the Earth and the cries of the most vulnerable. We broke with the flowing communion of love and sinned against you by not safeguarding the conditions for life. We lament the loss of our fellow species and their habitats, we grieve the loss of human cultures, along with the lives and livelihoods that have been displaced or perished, and we ache at the sight of an economy of death, war and violence that we have inflicted on ourselves and on the Earth.

Open our ears to your creative, reconciling and sustaining Word that calls to us through the book of Scripture and the book of creation. Bless us once again with your life-giving waters so that the Creator Spirit may let justice and peace flow in our hearts and overflow into all creation.

Open our hearts to receive the living waters of God's justice and peace, and to share it with our suffering brothers and sisters, all creatures around us, and all creation.

Bless us to walk together with all people of good will so that the many streams of the living waters of God's justice and peace may become a mighty river all over the Earth. In the name of the One who came to proclaim good news to all creation, Jesus Christ. Amen.

The August 9, 2023 ECC Council meeting was called to order at 7:45 P.M., by Moderator Lisa Herrmann; to jointly hear the Treasurers Reports for June 2023, and July 2023.

The Treasurers Reports for June 2023 and July 2023 were presented by Kathy Van Etten to both the ECC Trustees and the ECC Council. There will be a necessitated draw from the Endowment this month to meet the budget expenses. The monthly expenses have exceeded the incomes for the past two months.

The Joint meeting was ended by Chairman Steve Holloway adjourning the August 9, 2023 ECC Trustees Meeting at 7:47 P.M.

The ECC Council meeting for August 9, 2023 was formally called to order at 7:49 P.M. by Moderator Lisa Herrmann. Prayer was led by Kathy Van Etten. Attendees: Todd Montague, Melanie Herrmann, Steve Holloway, Kathy Van Etten, Pastor Gloria Smith. Tom Nasser, Lisa Herrmann, and Steve Barrett.

The ECC Council Meeting Minutes from the June 14, 2023 were reviewed, approved and accepted by all in attendance, into the Church Records.

Trustees Report was given Steve Holloway; we have a temporary space shortage for storing the incoming yard sale items. There are no new updates to report on the Church Sign's replacement. The speakers will be installed in the choir area, and the electrical shortage in the Choir area podium has been located and repairs are being scheduled. The ceiling tiles in the Fellowship Hall upstairs will also be repaired.

Pastor's Report was given by Pastor Gloria Smith; Season of Creation Study begins September 1, 2023. The ECC Pet Blessing signs will go up 2 weeks prior to the ECC October 1, 2023 Pet Blessing Services. The deadline for collecting the Disaster Relief Kits items is on August 20, 2023. The passing of the peace and the original Communion option will be returning this fall to the Sunday Communion Services, Communion options will be ½ traditional, and ½ prepackaged. UCC happenings: The Church of The Good Shepherd in Sahuarita, Arizona is a refugee shelter and just received a grant. Proceeds from a recent sale of a property will now return to the Beatitudes coffers. Pastor Gloria will be going on vacation this fall, the exact dates will be announced soon.

Stewardship Report: None.

Financial Secretary report given by Kathy Van Etten (for John Hasenstab), the monies are in the bank.

Religious Education Report given by Kathy Van Etten; the ECC Youth will be going to the water park on August 19, 2023.

Memorial Fund Report given by Kathy Stock, printed copies were handed out to all in attendance. Outreach Report was given by Melanie Herrmann; Christmas in August will be on Sunday, August

13, 2023 following Sunday Services. The ECC Garden Project will be starting up in the fall. The ECC Welcome packets are being prepared. The cards for the October 1, 2023 Pet Blessing will be distributed prior to the Blessing and will be distributed to area veterinarians, dog care centers, such as Dogtopia and other pet related facilities. The Neighbors in Need for 2023 has been added to the upcoming calendar.

Hospitality Report given by Todd Montague; the cookie bank inventory is getting low, the signup sheets are posted in the Fellowship Hall. The refreshment pitchers have been replaced.

Moderators Report given by Lisa Herrmann; we are working with Servant Keeper to update the ECC Directory and other Church Records. A handout\link was given to attendees regarding grant information from Interfaith Power & Light funded by the Department of Energy. The Church Calendar was reviewed and updated as needed.

Old Business: ECC's 80 year anniversary is coming soon.

* Pastor Gloria Smith will be also be celebrating Anniversaries of 30 years of Ordination, and 12 years as our Pastor at ECC.

New Business: None at this time.


