Pastoral Ponderings

Yesterday, I was participating in a series of training programs on keeping our church safe and secure. Thirty minutes into the workshop, I began to experience a sense of grief. Over the years of my adult life, I have felt grief when learning of bombings and attacks on synagogues and mosques throughout the world. I have grieved when African-American churches have been the victim of hate groups in America. Now, I grieve because all churches, synagogues and mosques are targets for individuals and groups who are inclined toward violence and destruction.

People of faith have been the target for anyone opposed to their beliefs or their cultural and racial prejudices and stereotypes. The perpetrators have been governmental regimes, hate groups, and even other faiths including Christians.

The human darkness that strives for power, control and even annihilation of those different from the face of the earth is a thread of behavior I continually hope will disappear as we evolve. Unfortunately, it has never vanquished and periodically increases as people feel threatened. Yet, there really is no threat to the predator only an irrational fear that dwells within their mind.

I believe that the founders of our nation had hoped to eliminate some of the fear and violence when writing the Constitution and Bill of Rights. From the separation of church and state to the establishment of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 we have tried to correct the behaviors of the past and domination of a class or race. Unfortunately, public laws do not change the mental attitudes, beliefs and fears of the individual. Even religion has failed to create a safe environment for individual differences and has been a perpetrator of violence and hate more often than not.

I believe that it is imperative that we expose ourselves to the teachings of various houses of faith, cultural differences, and the effects of governmental and cultural systems upon people of color or gender in order to dispel mistruths. We are God's vessels of equality, justice and the right to live without fear of violence.

It is a big challenge but each day we have unknown opportunities to learn and to teach about acceptance and love. May we commit each day to the realm of God on earth.

Trustees Report was given by Steve Holloway; The electrical problems with the speaker and other electrical issues in the alter area are being worked on. Lisa Herrmann is working on a grant for shade trees for the ECC Campus. The CPR Class was very successful. The price for the ECC Rose Garden cremains placement has increased.

Deacons Report was given by Pastor Gloria Smith; the October 1, 2023 ECC Pet Blessing details were all worked out. The Deacons will be completing the disaster kits for storage and readiness in upcoming needed events.


