Fellowship Hour

At the recent church council meeting, it came to the attention of the Hospitality co-chairs that there may be some confusion about treats. There are two ways to donate. A person or persons may bring a treat to share at Fellowship Hour after signing up on the ECC Treats Calendar. If that is the case, the person(s) are recognized by name on the display plate. If you do bring a treat, you need to bring 5 dozen. It may be one thing i.e. all chocolate chip cookies or a combination of your choice. The treat(s) may be sweet or savory or a combination of both. Treats may be homemade or store bought. If you do bring a treat, it needs to be in the kitchen by 9:30 so the staff can plate it and still get to church. The second option that happens is that we do try to have a "cookie" bank. We keep that in the freezer for emergencies such as when the person who signed up for treats was unable to come to church. With the "cookie" bank we don't do the recognition because they are pulled from the freezer randomly and sometimes mixed with ones that had been left from a prior Sunday. Sometimes people bake cookies at home and bring us the extras they had. Sometimes people have had a party; used bought cookies and had leftovers. We are happy to accept any extra cookies or treats that you may have. Thank you!



All week, every week, please remember that we collect a variety of items for recycling including plastic water bottles, aluminum cans, newspaper, catalogues, and scrap metal. Proceeds go to support various church activities. Please see Cindy or Michelle for details about where to leave the recyclables when you bring them to church. Thank you!

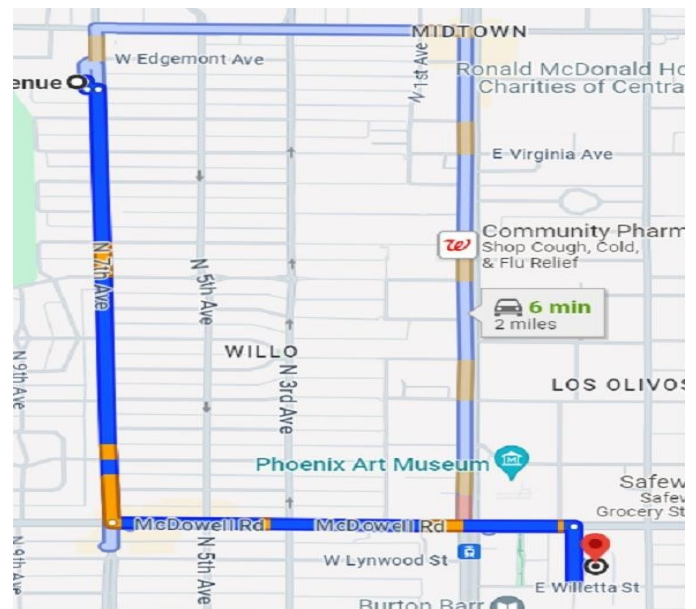
This should be an exciting time for all of us and I hope that you will make the commitment to attend both services. We will make transportation available for those who need a ride to the service at First Church UCC.

Council Meeting: January 21, 2024

The January 21, 2024 ECC Council meeting was called to order by Moderator Lisa Herrmann at 11:59 A.M.

Attendees: Kathy Van Etten, Pastor Gloria Smith, Melanie Herrmann, Todd Montague, Lisa Herrmann, Rev. Steve Barrett, John Hasenstab, Steve Holloway, and Kathy Stock.
Prayer was led by Todd Montague.

The minutes from the December ECC Joint meeting of the ECC Council and Trustees were reviewed, voted upon and accepted in to the Church records by all members in attendance.

The Treasurers Report was given by Kathy Van Etten, the finances were in the black closing out the 2023 year. The Endowment Fund bounced upward. Receipts were good, the expenses were up, and the annual distributions were made.

The Facilities Report was given by Steve Holloway; a new longer ladder is needed for the ECC Campus, and will be purchased soon. The parsonage water bill is now in the church's name, and will now be included in the monthly rent. The blinds are installed in the basement area windows. The smart locks are ready to be installed. The water leakage upstairs in the Fellowship Hall areas need to be resolved. The termite sites were treated twice, and also the rat and roach problems were treated. The Duke Property Group has been contacted to resolve the ECC Campus property misuse. Tony will be trimming the roses this year. The Trustees monthly meeting will now be held on the first Sunday of each month. The painting of the pickle ball court has been scheduled. The refrigerator in the caretaker's cottage has broken and a replacement has been ordered.

The Tech Report given by Steve Holloway; a third camera was successfully added during last Sunday's services.
Security Task Force Report: given by Lisa Herrmann; the Deacons training was done, and we will reach out to city wide groups and churches to keep current on any events or occurrences regarding ECC Campus Safety. Carillion costs are being researched.

The Deacons report was given by John Hasenstab, The security training was done and the Deacons annual assignment list is now completed. There will be no Easter Cantata, Joint services with area churches for Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday are being planned.

Financial Secretary Report given by John Hasenstab, the monies are in the bank. The pledge cards were received. During the Christmas Eve Services the offerings were received in the Christmas Marked boxes, none in the Christmas Stockings, so no more stockings.

Stewardship Report by John Hasenstab; the annual envelopes are needing to be ordered. New software for the financial secretary's usage and other ECC Office and record keeping functions are is being researched hopefully to be implemented during this calendar year.

Religious Education Report given by Kathy Van Etten; George Martinez will be presenting the Children's message in February on the Candlemas. We are gearing up for the spring 2024 yard sale. The Conference is not doing camps, but will be doing service day in June 2024, details will be forth coming so save the day.

Memorial Fund Report given by Kathy Stock; printed copies were given to all in attendance.

Outreach Report given by Melanie Herrmann; new members joined outreach, projects are being planned for the year. Outreach will meet on the 4th Sunday of each month, but will meet in February on Sunday, February 4, after Sunday Services.

Hospitality Report given by Todd Montague; we are needing more members to donate fellowship treats or cookie bank deposits.

Pastor's Report given by Pastor Gloria Smith; returned from a couple of weeks' vacation to a busy schedule this past Tuesday. ECC will be combining upcoming services with our UCC area churches, music will be a combined group also. Maundy Services will be hosted at Our ECC Campus for the soup. Posts will be put on our Facebook pages regarding service sites. First Congregational Church is selling their building but will purchase a new building site due to asbestos issues.

Moderators Report given by Moderator Lisa Herrmann; Council will define objectives for the upcoming year. Christmas dinner note to all; cleanup assistance is needed annually. The activities for the 2024 Church Calendar Events are being scheduled. The Church Software is being researched and will be purchased in a timely manner. Calendar updates and changes were made to the first quarter calendar.

Old Business: We are open for suggestions for soliciting volunteers for the upcoming events each month. The ECC Recipe Book Project is still pending. New Business: The Church Picnic will be discussed and planned during the February's Deacons meeting.

The ECC Council January 21, 2024 meeting was adjourned by Moderator Lisa Herrmann at 2:52 P.M.
