

Opening Prayer was led by Melanie Herrmann.

The March 23, 2025, Council Meeting Minutes were reviewed, voted upon and accepted into the church records by all in attendance.

Treasurer's Report given by Kathy Van Etten; Printed copies handed out to attendees, the ADHS Grant has been added to the Treasurer's Report, on the receipts page, the 5 Sundays in March were a godsend for the church. The unplanned expenses for March were for the copier repairs, the washer replacement for the parsonage, and the rose trimming. The Grant spending covered items ordered and several items received.

Trustees Report given by Steve Holloway; we are looking forward to installing the items received from ADHS Grant Money. We are also working on tree replacements for the front of the sanctuary, and work has been allocated for Martin on ECC Campus items needing repairs and maintenance. Security Task Force Report given by Lisa Herrmann; we are working on the payment problem with the megaphone vendor payment, so follow-up will be done this week. The lighting installation will begin during the 2nd week in May.

Outreach Report given by Melanie Herrmann; we are discussing blessing bags for the homeless this summer, costs will be covered by RE/OR, and we will be sourcing and dispensing sustainable and reusable items.

Financial Secretary's Report given by John Hasenstab; the monies are in the bank.

Memorial Fund Report given by Kathy stock; all in attendance were given a printed copy.

Religious Education Report given by Kathy Van Etten; our youth have been more active in our Sunday Services and will continue to do so for now. A few more weekly Civic classes remain before the summer break.

Hospitality Report given by Kathy Stock; we still have opening for Sunday Fellowship hour Host/Hostess as mentioned in the Sunday Morning's announcements. We will be covering the Nursery's stained-glass window with a curtain to block out the view of storage items in the Nursery.

Deacon's Report given by John Hasenstab; the Deacons are looking into purchasing reusable communion cups and dishwasher trays for cleaning. We will also purchase Matza crackers for Maundy Thursday and Easter Services. The ECC Picnic is on April 27, 2025, and all have been given tasks to complete. The Deacon's room is now cleaner and organized.

Pastor's Report given by Rev. Glora Smith; in May, the pastor from Shadow Rock UCC and I will be swapping Sunday Services, so Rev. Ken Heintzelman will be here at ECC on Mother's Day, and I will be at Shadow Rock UCC. Janet Maxwell and I will be attending the upcoming Annual UCC Southwest Conference being held in Albuquerque, NM this year. There are several UCC Resolutions being prepared to be reviewed and voted on in this upcoming session, such as the treatment of immigrants and the Gaza area treatments of fellow humans. My insulation will only be on a Friday in May and will be zoomed\streamed.







